
PRIESTLY FRATERNITY OF ST. JOSEPH: GREAT FALLS, MT. AUG 7-11

Out of respect to Our Lord and for the edification of our neighbor, we beg all men, boys, women, and girls to appear in Church modestly dressed.


- No gym clothes, yoga clothes, revealing clothes or pajamas.
- No bare shoulders on men or women
- No cleavage, no bare chests. Ladies cover up. Men button up.
- No mini-skirts. Skirts should cover the knees while seated. Men should wear long pants.
- No anti-Christian clothing, logos, jewelry, make-up.
- Tattoos should be covered
- Remove piercings of tongues, lips, cheeks, eyelids, noses, or enlarged ears, etc.
- No Cross-dressing.
- No hair color that is unnatural (green, orange, blue, pink, etc.)

FR. CHRISTOPHER BERNABE ASSIGNED AS PAROCHIAL VICAR

Fr. Christopher Bernabe will arrive on Monday, July 3rd and begin his assignment here as parochial vicar, to assist Fr. Andersen, who will begin his second term as pastor of St. Stephen's July 1st.

Fr. Bernabe and Fr. Andersen are both members of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Joseph, a public association of the Christian faithful, which "aims to foster the sanctity of priests, particularly through devotion to St. Joseph, the Protector of Our Blessed Lord, Jesus Christ, the Husband of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary, and the Patron of the Universal Church, edifying fraternity with brother priests, and the reverent and devoted celebration of Holy Mother Church's Sacred Roman Liturgy, particularly in the Usus Antiquior" (Decree of Bishop Warfel, Great Falls, MT., June 11th, 2021). Fr. Bernabe was ordained in 2014 and is coming from the Archdiocese of Santa Fe, NM.

Fr. Bernabe's assignment here is not due to the size of the parish, or according to regular diocesan assignments, but through the graciousness of the Archbishop and his authority to invite Fr. Bernabe to reside at St. Stephen's *ad experimentum* for the sake of establishing common priestly life under the model of religious life. The Finance Council is in support of the expense, but has recommended that we reach out to parishioners and let them know the financial needs of the parish. If there are parishioners willing to sponsor a line item on the budget, such as the salary of a second priest, or the Conditional Use Permit Process for the school building, etc., please see Fr. Andersen.
