ST. MARTIN'S LENT - 40 DAYS BEFORE CHRISTMAS Nov 12th - Dec 24th

The current law of the Church requires no penance or fasting during Advent, except the usual abstinence on Fridays. But, going back at least as early as the year AD 480, the practice in France was fasting on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from the feast of St. Martin of Tours until Christmas. By the ninth century, Advent was reduced in the West to four weeks. Likewise, fasting was reduced to abstinence by the 12th century. By the 13th century, only the monks were required to keep the Advent discipline. In 1962, the law of the Church required the faithful to fast and abstinence from meat on December 7th: the Vigil of the Immaculate Conception; and on the three Ember Days of Advent: Wednesday December 20th; Friday, December 22nd, Saturday, December 23rd and Christmas Eve (December 24th). This year, Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday, so that no fasting or penance are required since it is the Lord's Day.

The following are suggestions on how to observe St. Martin's Lent:

Sundays and Solemnities St. Martin's Lent (Nov 12-Dec 2)

no penance, fasting or abstinence Partial Abstinence every day except Sunday Full Abstinence on Wednesday and Friday

Thanksgiving Day (Nov 23rd) no penance, fasting or abstinence

Advent (Dec 3-24th)

Ember Days (Dec 20, 22, 23) **Vigils** (Dec 7th/24th)

Partial Abstinence every day except Sunday Fast/Abstinence on Wednesday and Friday Fast/Partial or Full Abstinence







PLENARY INDULGENCES FOR NOVEMBER

1. Visit to a Cemetery (Nov 1st - 8th)

An indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. The indulgence is plenary each day from the 1st to the 8th of November; on other days of the year it is partial. Prayers for a Visit to a Cemetery are available in the narthex. It is sufficient, however, to pray the following:

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon them.

May they rest in peace. Amen.

May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace, Amen.

Our Father & Apostles Creed for the intentions of the Holy Father

2. A Visit to a Church or Oratory on All Souls Day (November 2)

A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who on the day dedicated to the Commemoration of all the faithful departed piously visit a church, a public oratory or — for those entitled to use it — a semi-public oratory. In visiting the church or oratory, it is required that one *Our Father* and the *Apostles Creed* be recited.
