#### PLENARY INDULGENCES FOR NOVEMBER

#### 1. Visit to a Cemetery (November 1st – 8th)

An indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. The indulgence is plenary each day from the 1st to the 8th of November; on other days of the year it is partial. Prayers for a Visit to a Cemetery are available in the narthex. It is sufficient, however, to pray the following:

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace, Amen.

#### 2. A Visit to a Church or Oratory on All Souls Day (November 2)

A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Souls in Purgatory, is granted to the faithful, who on the day dedicated to the Commemoration of all the faithful departed piously visit a church, a public oratory or — for those entitled to use it — a semi-public oratory. In visiting the church or oratory, it is required that one *Our Father* and the *Apostles Creed* be recited.

#### **ALL SOULS DAY**

Thursday, **November 2nd**. Low Requiem Masses at 8 am and 12 Noon. Sung Requiem Mass at 7 pm. A plenary Indulgence is offered November 1-8th applicable only to the Holy Souls in Purgatory for visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead. Each priest will offer three Masses this day.

#### FR. BERNABE 40TH BIRTHDAY & ALL SAINTS COSTUME PARTY




