

There will be **no** CCD classes during Christmas Break on December 22nd and 29th.


### NEWS & EVENTS AT ST. STEPHEN

#### **ADVENT RORATE MASSES - SATURDAY DEC 14th**

7 am. High Mass. A "Rorate Mass" is a votive Mass to the Blessed Virgin Mary during Advent. The Mass begins while it is dark. The church is lit only by candlelight, and the faithful hold tapers. As the Mass progresses, the sun rises and the light slowly increases through the windows of the church. It is a reminder that Advent awaits the coming of the Light of the World: Jesus Christ.

#### **BALLROOM DANCING LESSONS**
