NINE TUESDAYS NOVENA TO ST. ANTHONY - WEEK 3

Beginning Tuesday, April 16th and concluding Tuesday, June 11th. The Feast of St. Anthony falls this year on Thursday, June 13th. Many favors have been obtained by those who have made this Novena. Here are the rules:

- 1) Recite for nine consecutive Tuesdays the prayer or prayers you find most appropriate (provided in the church and on the website)
- 2) Endeavor to imitate his virtues.
- Receive within the period of the Novena, if possible, the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.
- 4) Promise alms for St. Anthony's Bread for the poor, if you have the means.

We will pray the Novena in the church and you can also watch the 2022 video series (listed under playlists: Nine Tuesdays of St. Anthony) on the parish YouTube channel.

SOLEMNITY OF ST. JOSEPH, WORKMAN

Josef Pieper writes that in 1922, "May 1st became more and more exclusively a day on which the Soviet Union displayed its military strength in gigantic parades. ... The very same was true of the gigantic May Day celebrations of the Nazi regime" (In Tune With the World, p. 77). In 1934 May 1st was renamed "National Holiday of the German People" and was "the prime occasion for striking displays of weapons of destruction, which the regime was already accumulating in preparation for total war" (Pieper 79).

In 1937, Pope Pius XI issued an encyclical *Divini Redemptoris* on atheistic communism, writing: "We place the vast campaign of the Church against world Communism under the standard of Saint Joseph, her mighty Protector. He belongs to the working class...and in a life of faithful performance of everyday duties, he left an example for all those who must gain their bread by the toil of their hands" (cf. §§ 44, 45). In 1955, Venerable Pope Pius XII named May 1st as the Feast of St. Joseph, Opifex (Craftsman). The word 'opifex' indicates that human work is different from the work of animals. Human work is creative, participating in the work of God. An opifex (craftsman) seeks to emulate the opus Dei (the work of God).

The Solemnity will begin on Tuesday evening April 30th at 5 pm with First Vespers and continue through Wednesday, **May 1st.**

THE NOVENA FOR PENTECOST: MAY 10-18

When Our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven to claim His Heavenly Throne, the Apostles, the disciples and the women, gathered in the cenacle to pray for the coming of the Holy Ghost. After Nine Days of prayer, they received tongues of fire on Pentecost. We imitate the apostles in the original novena of the Church and pray for the same nine days. Copies of the prayer will be distributed and available on the parish website at that time.
