CHURCH UNITY OCTAVE JANUARY 18-25

This octave was established by Pope Benedict XV in 1916 as the "Chair of Unity Octave" beginning on the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter on January 18th and ending on the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul on January 25th. The pope established this octave of prayer "that Christians who have unfortunately withdrawn from the Catholic Faith should at length be recalled to it as to a forsaken Mother." Indulgences are available for those who participate. A full set of prayers and daily intentions, as published by Pope Pius XII in 1956 for the Octave will be prayed after Mass each day during the Octave.

BURYING OF THE ALLELUIA. SATURDAY, JANUARY 27TH

5 pm. First Vespers of Septuagesima concludes with a solemn "Benedicamus Domino, alleluia, alleluia". The 'alleluia' will not be heard again until the Easter Vigil on March 30th. The very word "alleluia" will be buried at the Saint Joseph Altar, as a sign of mourning. Please join us to bid a mournful fareful to this blessed word as we enter into the Pre-Lenten season.

CANDLEMAS - THE PURIFICATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN

Friday, February 2nd. The 40th day after the Nativity of the Lord is marked by the blessing and procession of small candles in honor of the Presentation of the Child Jesus. The blessed tapers are sacramentals for the faithful to take home. You may bring candles to be blessed, but let them be of beeswax, or partially of beeswax. Regular household candles will not be blessed. This is the last of the feasts of the Christmas cycle. Vespers on this day will conclude with the singing of the *Alma Redemptoris Mater*. At Compline, the singing of the *Ave Regina Caelorum* will commence and last through Septuagesima and Lent. Low Mass at 12 Noon. High Mass at 7 pm.
