Beginning the first Wednesday of March, we will pray the Litany of St. Joseph and sing the chant to St. Joseph after Mass on Wednesday evenings through the month. Also on Sundays during March, we will pray the Seven Sorrows and Joys of St. Joseph at 2 pm.

# **VINTAGE CARNIVAL DANCE PARTY - GET DRESSED UP!**

No provocative costumes allowed. At the end of the evening, we will kneel and pray the Our Father, then stand and wish everyone around a blessed Lent.

# **ADORATION & REPARATION ON QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY**

Sunday, **March 2nd**. Quinquagesima Sunday is the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. Historically, this has been known as "40 Hours Sunday" because the 40 Hours Devotion was begun on this day and completed on Fat Tuesday. These 40 Hours filled the last three days of Carnival with Adoration and the customary processions of the Blessed Sacrament, adding to the festivities of Carnival but also offering an opportunity to gain an indulgence and make reparation for sins committed during Carnival. A Plenary Indulgence is offered to the faithful who will spend at least 30 minutes praying in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. We will expose the Blessed Sacrament for Adoration following the 10:30 am High Mass and conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament after Sung Vespers at 4:30 pm.

# **ASH WEDNESDAY - DAY OF FAST AND ABSTINENCE**

Wednesday, March 5th. You may receive ashes at any of the following:

- 6:45 am Sung Lauds and Prime
- 8 am Low Latin Mass
- 5 pm Sung Vespers (evening prayer)
- 7 pm. Missa Cantata (sung Latin Mass)

Additionally, Confessions will be heard from 5:45-6:45 pm.

# **CURRENT RULES FOR FASTING AND ABSTINENCE**

Fast is defined as one full meal permitted and two other meals which, when combined, are less than a full meal. Fasting applies to those aged 18 through 59. Abstinence obliges abstention from flesh meat and applies to

those over age 14. Fast and abstinence are required on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Abstinence is of obligation on Fridays during Lent.

#### HISTORICAL PRACTICES OF FAST/ABSTINENCE

One may choose to do more. At the time of the 1962 Missal, Catholics were obliged to fast all days of Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday. One full meal permitted and two other meals may be taken, which, when combined, are less than a full meal (defined as 2 oz of food at breakfast and 8 oz of food at supper). Abstinence from meat and meat products was obliged all Fridays of the year, Ash Wednesday, Holy Saturday, and the Vigil of Christmas. Partial abstinence (meat and soup or gravy made from meat permitted once a day at the principle meal): all the days of Lent other than Fridays. Abstinence from meat is dispensed on Holy Days of Obligation. No fast or abstinence is practiced on Sundays. # WEDNESDAY EVENING MASSES DURING LENT

Beginning Ash Wednesday, we will begin a series of Wednesday evening Masses, including a sermon. On Ash Wednesday, there will be a morning Mass in addition to the evening Mass. On the other Wednesdays, there will be no morning Mass. The evening begins with Vespers at 5 pm; Confessions from 5:30-6:30 pm. If there are volunteers, we can add Adoration.

# THE DEVOTIONAL OUTLOOK OF THE LEGION OF MARY

The devotional outlook of the Legion is reflected in its prayers. The Legion is built in the first place upon a profound faith in God and in the love He bears His children. He wills to draw great glory from our efforts, and He will purify them and render them fruitful and persevering. We swing between the opposite extremes of apathy and feverish anxiety because we regard Him as detached from our work. Instead, let us realise that we only have the good purpose because He has implanted it, and that we shall only bring it to fruition if He sustains us all the time. The success of the enterprise in hand is more by far to Him than it is to us. Infinitely more than we, does He desire that conversion we are seeking. We wish to be saints. He yearns for it a million times more than we. (Legio Mariae Handbook, pp.17-18).

Fr. Andersen, presenter. This month, we will delve into "The Catholic Controversy: A Defense of the Faith" by St. Francis de Sales. In 1594, 27 year old, newly ordained Fr. Francis de Sales was sent by his bishop to evangelize and convert the Calvinists in Chablais near Lake Geneva. The Calvinists would not listen to him and his life was in danger. He countered by publishing leaflets and distributing them door-to-door. The work now known as "The Catholic Controversy" is the collection of these leaflets posthumously published in book form. How did St. Francis de Sales succeed? "Four centuries after they were written, St. Francis' essays retain much of their original vivacity and charm" (Introduction, 2022. TAN Books ed.).
