40 DAY PREPARATION:

CONSECRATION TO ST. JOSEPH & THE HOLY FAMILY

Begins Feb. 8th. Consecration date: March 19th (Feast of St. Joseph). Pick up your booklet in the narthex of the church. This method is a 40 day preparation adapted from Fr. Dominic de Domenico, O.P.'s book True Devotion to St. Joseph and the Church; and from St. Louis de Montfort.

Sunday, February 11th after the 10:30 am Mass. Bring an Egg Casserole, sausage, bacon, pastries, fresh fruit or other brunch items. We are heading into Lent after this. It's the last chance before Easter for a fancy meal. Volunteers wanted to help make pancakes and perhaps even waffles (hint: bring a waffle iron and prepared batter. Let's see who can make the best waffles.)

ASH WEDNESDAY FEBRUARY 14TH

Low Masses at 8 am & 12 Noon. Sung Mass at 7 pm. Be sure to prepare your Lenten goals ahead of time and be ready to go for Ash Wednesday. Lenten worksheets are available now in the Narthex of the church. Ash Wednesday is a day of Fast and Abstinence.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE

The Catholic Fast means one full meal, and two small snacks that do not equal a full meal. The rules for fasting have changed over the centuries, but historically one might eat the following: a “fustulum” of 2 ounces of bread (or other food) in the morning; a full meal in the midday/mid-afternoon (for example: an entree, side dish, vegetable, fruit for dessert); and a “collation” limited to 8 ounces of food in the evening.

Begins Friday, February 16th. 5 pm Vespers. 5:45 pm Potluck Soup Supper in Carmody Hall. Bring a meatless soup, or grilled cheese sandwiches, or something tasty and meatless. No Meat. No Desserts. 7 pm Stations of the Cross in the church. 7:45 pm Adoration and Sung Compline. Head home by 8:30 pm.
