# NEWS & EVENTS AT ST. STEPHEN

#### **ADVENT PENANCE AND FASTING:**

The current law of the Church requires no penance or fasting during Advent, except the usual abstinence on Fridays. But, going back at least as early as the year AD 480, the practice in France was fasting on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from the feast of St. Martin of Tours until Christmas. By the ninth century, Advent was reduced in the West to four weeks. Likewise, fasting was reduced to abstinence by the 12th century. By the 13th century, only the monks were required to keep the Advent discipline. In 1962, the law of the Church required the faithful to fast and abstinence from meat on December 7th: the Vigil of the Immaculate Conception; and on the three Ember Days of Advent: Wednesday December 20th; Friday, December 22nd, Saturday, December 23rd and Christmas Eve (December 24th). This year, Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday, so that no fasting or penance are required since it is the Lord's Day.

The following are suggestions on how to observe Advent: Sundays and Solemnities: no penance, fasting or abstinence Advent (Dec 3-24th):

Partial Abstinence every day except Sunday Fast/Abstinence on Wednesday and Friday Ember Days (Dec 20, 22, 23): Fast & Partial/Full Abstinence

# **RORATE MASSES IN ADVENT - SATURDAY, DEC 16TH, 7 AM**

Rorate Masses are Masses of the Blessed Virgin Mary on Saturday during Advent. These Masses are celebrated early in the morning in the dark, with the church dimly lit, and the sanctuary and altar illuminated only by candles.

# **CHRISTMAS NOVENA: DEC 16-24**

This year's novena will once again be prayed from the Advent Family Devotions pamphlet. Pick up a copy from the church or print out from the website (available on the bulletin page of the parish website—dated December 16th). A new video series will be posted on the parish YouTube channel. This year we will learn from St. Thomas Aquinas on the perfection of the Christ Child at His Conception; and various considerations on His Nativity.
